2. CONCERT ATTIRE

There is a \$25 uniform maintenance class fee for all students. All performing groups will follow the following dress guidelines for formal and informal performances:

FORMAL ATTIRE

BOYS: white oxford long sleeve dress shirt with button down collar, and black dress pants, socks, and dress shoes. Boys will be assigned and receive a tuxedo coat at the beginning of the school year. Students will be provided a bow tie and cummerbund.

GIRLS: will be assigned and receive a formal gown at the beginning of the school year. Girls may wear black heels under 2" or flats.

INFORMAL ATTIRE FOR ALL STUDENTS

- White oxford long sleeve dress shirts for boys & girls tucked in at the waist.
- Black dress pants solid black, no designs for boys & girls
- Black shoes no sports shoes allowed. (For girls, heels should not exceed 2" due to safety hazards on the risers.)
- Black or navy blue socks. Girls are allowed to wear black or natural colored hosiery.
- No facial jewelry is permitted. **Earrings** should not exceed ½ inch.

FIELD TRIP ATTIRE

All students will wear uniform polo shirts and blue jeans. Jeans must have no holes, tears, or rips. Sneakers are permitted as well as flats or boots.

Please note: <u>un-natural colored hair is HIGHLY DISCOURAGED!!!</u>

Uniforms are provided for all Honor Choir students to be worn only for formal concerts and music festival competitions. Each student will be assigned a uniform. **PARENTS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE TO REPLACE ANY LOST OR STOLEN UNIFORM, OR DAMAGED UNIFORM.**



3. Concert Attendance

As choir is a performance based course and in order for the performance experience to be successful attendance is a key component.

CONCERT ATTENDANCE IS MANDATORY FOR ALL HONOR CHOIR STUDENTS.

Attendance for Jazz Night will only be required for those students who are selected for Jazz Choir.

Excused absences include personal illness or family emergencies. Parents are asked to send a written excuse upon the student's return to school. All students excused from a concert will be given an out of class assignment to make up for concert performance points. Students who are suspended from school on a concert date will also be required to complete the out of class assignment to earn concert points. Absences for out of town family trips will need to be excused in advance in accordance to District policy. Unexcused absences will result in a "**ZERO - 0**" to be averaged with other grades received that grading period. **Late work policy** - 10 % off each day for 3 days and then 50%.



4. CLASSROOM RULES

All choral students will follow the discipline policy of Skyview Middle School. Minor violations will be handled as follows:

2nd offense email/phone call to parents

□ 3rd offense written referral to office with possible further consequences

All major violations will result in an automatic referral to the office and phone call to parents in accordance to school policy. The major and most import part of rules that I emphasize is:


RESPECT FOR:

5. GRADING SYSTEM

<u>ALL STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO PRACTICE!</u> A weekly participation grade will reflect student practice times. Students who fail to log their records by the end of each week will receive a failing participation grade for that week without grace for makeup.

Parents will be responsible for music that is lost, stolen and/or damaged. Students who fail to come prepared with daily supplies will receive a warning. Three warnings will constitute a phone call to parents.

LARGE ENSEMBLE CONTEST

The CHSAA Colorado Springs Large Ensemble Contest is held each spring. **ALL HONOR CHOIR STUDENTS ARE REQUIRED TO PARTICIPATE AS A CHOIR.** This festival is held during the school day at a local high school hosting the event. There will be a small fee for transportation and registration. Parents are encouraged to attend and/or chaperone. There is a small registration fee for each student. More information will be provided pursuant to the festival date. Please refer to the choir website for detailed information.

Colorado Academic Standards for Music

The Colorado Academic Standards in music are the topical organization of the concepts and skills all Colorado students should know and be able to do throughout their preschool through twelfth-grade experience.

1. Expression of Music

The expression of music is the demonstration of human thought and emotion through the medium of performance, which is a product of knowledge and skills gained in the study of music.

2. Creation of Music

The creation of music is the demonstration of learned skills in the composition, improvisation, and arranging of music. Creating music involves writing music, fashioning new music from an existing piece of music, or forming an entirely new piece of music.

3. Theory of Music

The theory of music is the understanding of the distinctive language, conventions, mechanics, and structure of organized sound. Investigation of music theory allows for a more complete understanding of all aspects of the musical process, including musical performance and composition.

4. Aesthetic Valuation of Music

The value of music focuses on the knowledge needed to make an informed evaluation and to provide a well-thought-out critique about a musical piece. It also addresses the beauty, heart, and soul: the aesthetics of music. Valuing music will permit individuals to distinguish between a scholarly and an individual judgment of music.
